- Are passionate about promoting Liberation, Equality, Diversity and Inclusion in the University of Greenwich.
- Are passionate about a cause that you want to advance.
- Want to get involved with GSU and our campaigning work to improve the student experience for all students!

Liberation Chair duties:

- Attend monthly check-ins with GSU staff during term-time to track their objectives.
- Participate in EDI Panels to improve the experiences of marginalised groups in the University of Greenwich and GSU.
- Help to promote events and activities during the appropriate History Month, and get involved with Liberation Lunches to enable networking between university staff and students.
- Represent their Liberation group at Student Assembly.

How to become a Liberation Chair:

- Nominate yourself via the elections webpage by 22nd September!
- Create a manifesto that details all of the work that you want to do if you are successful in winning the election- this also has to be submitted by 22nd September.
- Get people to vote for you! Voting opens at 9am on 24th September, and closes at 5pn on 26th September - that's not much time, so make sure to be ready with your campaign!
